## SIMILAR VERSES IN LUKE

**1:80** And the child grew and became strong in spirit and he lived in the wilderness until he appeared publicly to Israel.

2:40 And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.

2:19 But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.

**2:51** Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. <u>But his mother treasured all these</u> things in her heart.

**2:25** Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. <u>He was waiting for the consolation of Israel</u>, and the Holy Spirit was on him.

**2:38** Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were <u>looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem</u>.
